For those who were not with us last Sunday, I was speaking about how so many now do not believe in what the Old Testament says to us. That the stories and books are just ramblings and not from God. My argument is essentially that every prophet starts off with, "God said to me, or God instructed me to say." And even the first 5 books of the Old Testament were placed into Moses by God, "and he (Moses) wrote down everything the Lord had said." Exodus 24:4. Seems God is involved quite extensively in what many say is an obsolete book.

However, I think the best argument for the validity of the Old Testament is that Jesus used its scriptures for all His teachings and even parables. Note, the New Testament writings weren't even started until around AD 55 to 60, 25 years after Jesus ascension.

And speaking of the ascension. Just before Jesus left, He prepared the disciples for the tasks that were now to be placed before them. He first said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the prophets, and the Psalms." Then He opened their minds so they could understand the scriptures. Luke 24:44-45. To understand the "Old Testament" scriptures.

He then outlined their mission. He said that repentance and forgiveness was to be preached to the world, starting with Jerusalem, and then they would receive the gift of the Holy Spirit as promised by His Father. Luke 24:47 and 49. All that was also foretold within the Old Testament.

The word of God is real, true, and revealed not only in the Old Testament, but in the New Testament as well. And it is amazing how the one directs and supports the other. This book, our Bible, is God's wonderful gift to all humanity. I pray you feel the same as me, and will read His word and search for His guidance every chance you get.
