Well, to those who never were able to start or finish this book, or to those who have read it to the end, you may have missed the best message Jesus could ever bring to you and me. Let's take a look at the last 2 verses of the book of Revelation, Chapter 22:20-21. John writes, "He who testifies to these things says, 'Yes, I am coming quickly.' Amen. Come Lord Jesus. The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all. Amen." NASB

Only two lines, but they are so powerful. It was pointed out to me that they hold 3 promises to those who stay true to Jesus.

First- Jesus says, "Yes I am coming quickly." These are the last words given to John by Jesus. Notice Jesus said, "quickly." We need to be ready for His return; at a time, we may not even expect. We must never let our guard down because we won't have time to prepare. So, we need to always be ready.

Second- We are given the very last prayer in the Bible. John writes, "Amen, come Lord Jesus." Should we not also be praying daily for the return of Jesus?

Third- John gives us a beautiful benediction, "The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all. Amen." Grace! We sing about it, read about it, and talk about it. But, until His return, we need His grace within us every hour of every day. Grace that will nourish, uphold, and sustain us until His glorious return.

So, you see, maybe this book isn't as frightening as you may have thought. We all have ups and downs in life, even some pretty scary moments. But if we hold onto His grace, pray for His return, and know that His return is eminent, nothing in life is too frightening to take us away from Jesus' loving promises!
